Suspects: Multiple

Details: On 02/24/2012, Newport Police Officers responded to 615 NW Nye Street on two different occasions on reports of intoxicated subjects and fights at the residence. Officers encountered 10 to 12 intoxicated persons at the residence on each visit to the home. At about 4:37 p.m., Officers were called back to the residence for a third reported fight in progress. Upon arrival, Officers again contacted 10 to 12 persons in the home. The living room of the home had been heavily damaged, with furniture and other items strewn about. One of the occupants was injured, but refused medical treatment and refused to tell officers what had occurred or who had assaulted him. One of persons contacted was David Michael Zigler, age 45, who is homeless but known to live in the Newport area. Zigler is on probation for a previous conviction for a sex offense; he was in violation of his probation because he was intoxicated.

Zigler was taken into custody for Probation Violation and lodged at the Lincoln County Jail.

Details: On 01/20/2012, Newport Police Officers responded to 6138 Hwy 101 #2 on a report of a domestic disturbance. Officers contacted a female, who was suffering a serious laceration to her face. She told officers that the suspect, William Lee Hunter, age 37 of Newport, had smashed a dinner plate and then slashed her face with a piece of it. Officers were unable to locate the suspect at the time. The same female had been the victim of domestic violence by Hunter in November of 2011, and had obtained a restraining order against him. The victim fled the Newport area, but contacted police again on 02/24/2012 to provide additional details for the investigation. Hunter had been threatening her to recant her initial report, not return to Newport, and not talk to police again.

On 02/24/2012, at about 9:20 p.m., Officers located Hunter at his residence to arrest him. Hunter was uncooperative and had to be forcibly removed from his residence by the investigating officers.

Hunter was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on charges of Assault I, Menacing, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Violation of a Restraining Order, and Tampering with a Witness. His bail was set at \$380,000.

Details: On 02/25/2012, at 7:35 p.m., Newport Police Officers responded to a report of domestic disturbance in the South Beach Marina parking lot. Initial information indicated that TCB Security officers were on scene, attempting to keep the involved parties separated. When Police Officers arrived, they contacted a female who had been assaulted. She was suffering from injuries to her face and one hand. Police Officers contacted her domestic partner, Nickolas A. Aparicio, age 37 of Salem, who was suffering a minor laceration to his face. Both parties were intoxicated. The camp trailer they were staying in was damaged, and a large window had been shattered. Both parties were treated at the scene by staff from Pacific West Ambulance, and refused further medical treatment.

Aparicio was arrested at the scene and lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on charges of Assault IV, Menacing, and Harassment. His bail was set at \$40,000.

Details: On 02/25/2012, at 8:03 p.m., a Newport Police Officer encountered an obvious domestic disturbance between a male and female in the 700 block of SW Bay Blvd. While investigating the disturbance, the Police Officer learned that the male, Micah J. Stowe, age 40 of Springfield, had arrived at the location moments earlier and parked his car nearby, facing traffic. Stowe admitted driving to the location; he was displaying indicators of impairment. Stowe consented to field sobriety tests, which he failed. He was taken into custody for DUII.

Stowe was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on charges of DUII, after providing a breath sample that registered .15% BAC, almost twice the legal limit under Oregon law. His bail was set at \$15,000.

Details: On 02/25/2012, at 8:29 p.m., Newport Police Officers were called to the 300 block of NE 2nd Street by a homeowner requesting assistance with an intoxicated subject in her yard. When Police Officers arrived, they learned that the homeowner had heard a noise at her door, opened it to investigate, and was confronted by an intoxicated male subject. When she asked him to leave, he began screaming at her, dancing in her yard, and calling out to her.

Officers contacted Vance Lee Tatum, age 40 of Depoe Bay, at the residence. He was found to be intoxicated and uncooperative. He was arrested for

Disorderly Conduct II, and lodged at the Lincoln County Jail. His bail was set at \$10,000.

Details: On 02/25/2012, at 8:49 p.m., Newport Police Officers were called to the 400 block of SW Bay Blvd on a report of a subject who was intoxicated, caused a disturbance, and kicked a car. When Police Officers arrived they learned from witnesses that the subject had not only kicked a car and caused a verbal disturbance, but was observed urinating on multiple vehicles that were parked nearby. When one of the car owners confronted him, he challenged the car owner to a fight.

Officers located Adam Wilson, age 32 of Albany, who was identified by multiple witnesses as the suspect. He was taken into custody for Disorderly Conduct II, and lodged at the Lincoln County Jail with bail set at \$10,000.

Details: On 02/26/2012, at 2:32 a.m., Newport Police Officers responded to the Elizabeth Street Inn on a report of a domestic disturbance. Officers were contacted by management staff and guests in neighboring rooms who told officers that a woman was being assaulted. Police Officers made contact with Monica Lee Voigt, age 35 of Seattle, and her domestic partner, Jeremy William Allen, age 34 of Seattle. Both were intoxicated and uncooperative, and the room had been damaged. Voigt was suffering from a stab wound to one of her legs and lacerations to her hands. She refused to tell officers what had occurred. When Allen was placed under arrest, he fought with officers and was not brought under control until subdued by a Taser. Voigt was treated by Pacific West Ambulance staff and transported to Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital (SPCH) for further medical treatment.

Allen was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on charges of Disorderly Conduct II, Resisting Arrest, and Criminal Mischief II. His bail was set at \$40,000.

At about 3:50 a.m., Newport Police Officers were called to SPCH where they learned that Voigt had become uncooperative with medical staff. She struck two nurses who were trying to treat her injuries. The nurses were not injured. When her treatment was completed, Voigt was taken into custody, but fought with officers before being subdued. Voigt was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on charges of Harassment, Disorderly Conduct II, and Resisting Arrest. Her bail was set at \$40,000.
