CITY OF NEWPORT, OREGON AGENCY SOCIAL SERVICE GRANT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is between the City of Newport, an Oregon municipal corporation (City), and Agape Respite Center (Grantee).

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

USE OF FUNDS

Funding for this agreement is intended to assist the organization in the delivery of their services, as outlined in Exhibit A.

2. COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT

The Grantee shall be paid a max lump sum amount of \$25,000 for services identified in Section 1.

Payment to Grantee shall be made by City, after receipt by the City of a W-9.

3. SUBMITTING NOTICE

4. STATUS OF GRANTEE

Grantee certifies that:

WARRANTY & INDEMNIFICATION

Grantee certifies that:

- A. Grantee is fully liable for the acts and omissions of Grantee that cause any damage, injury, death, property damage or loss to any person or property.
- B. Grantee will indemnify and defend the City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers and hold them harmless from any and all liability, causes of action, claims, losses, damages, judgments, or other costs or expenses including attorney's fees that may be asserted by any person or entity which in any way arise from, during, or in connection with, the performance of the work described in this Agreement. Grantee's indemnification shall also cover claims brought against the City under state or federal workers' compensation laws. If any aspect of this indemnity shall be found to be illegal or invalid for any reason whatsoever, the illegality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this indemnification.

6. FINAL REPORT

Grantee shall submit a final report, by June 1, 2025, showing how the grant funds were used, and the results of the project from June 2024 through June 2025.

7. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND RULES

Grantee shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations.

Our Impacts

- After Oregon experienced the largest increase in homelessness in any state between 2020 and 2022, and Grace Wins Haven closed, our services have become even more essential for those experiencing homelessness.
- In the last 90 days, Agape Respite Center has helped 139 unique homeless clients in Newport.
- Clients come in for food, clean clothing, camping gear, showers, laundry support, mail services, and connections to resources.
- Our most utilized services are the sack lunches we provide and the shower facilities.

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Expansion and Support of Laundry Services

- The money from the grant would go to ensure that clients have clean clothes, which is fundamental for their physical and mental health and well-being.
- Grant funds would go towards: purchasing a stackable washer and dryer, laundry detergents, stain removers, dryer sheets.
- Funding would also go towards maintaining machines and dryer vents so that we can continue providing this much needed service.







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Enhancing Shower Facilities



- Funding would help us provide clean and safe shower facilities for our clients.
- By providing this essential service, it helps prevent the spread of illnesses and disease, which keeps people healthy and out of the hospital.
- Funding would also go towards purchasing, sanitizing, and maintaining the shower trailer.
- It would also go towards buying shower supplies for clients such as towels, soaps, shampoos and other necessary hygiene products.

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Providing Nutritious Meals

- Funds from this grant could help Agape Respite Center provide nutritious warm meals and/or sack lunches for those in need.
- Having consistent nutritious food in their diet is just one way that Agape can help provide people with a way to stay satiated and healthy.
- The grant would help us purchase the ingredients we need to make lunches and warm meals for those that might have otherwise gone hungry.

- By acquiring this grant, we will able to continue to assist clients in maintaining a stable mailing address, which is crucial for receiving important documents and communications.
- With Agape's mail services, people can stay up to date with important services, such as healthcare appointment information and potential housing assistance information and so much more.
